If your certificate is actually lost, a duplicate will be issued upon your simple statement that it is "actually lost."

In most cases, however, an application for a duplicate certificate is prompted by a desire to change the beneficiary. If the original certificate is in the hands of some other person and a duplicate is issued, which would in turn be assigned to another beneficiary, then upon your death, in all probability, two claims would be made for the benefits. If the Order were sued by either party, it would pay the money into court and let the two beneficiaries fight it out.
