BROTHER JOHN F. STAY, M.E.M.A. MAY HE REST IN PEACE

Brother John F. Stay P.M.E.M.A. and member of Pennsylvania Assembly No. 3 passed away on Monday, December 1, 2014 at the age of 99. John was not only a great Artisan but more importantly, he was a great man and achieved much over his long life. Brother Stay volunteered for service in the United States Navy at the age of 29 serving in World War II. His major accomplishment, while in the military, was that he was the one who signed the discharge papers for baseball legend, Ted Williams. Following his discharge from the Navy, he joined the American Legion and became Post Commander in 1949 for the Russell Conwell Post 264. He then became Pennsylvania Vice-Commander in 1952 and Pennsylvania State Commander in 1955. John then rose to the 2nd highest national position of the American Legion as National Vice-Commander in 1956. He started his career with the Artisans in 1955 as Membership Director and was instrumental in helping form Philadelphia Assembly No.1 as the first female Artisan Assembly. Consequently, forming another 5 women's assemblies throughout the tri-state area. Brother Stay was the Most Excellent Master Artisan for the Order's 100th Anniversary in 1973 where he accepted accolades for the Order from Mayor Frank Rizzo, Governor of Pennsylvania, Milton Shapp and the President of the United States, Richard Nixon. In addition to his activity in the Artisans and American Legion, John was a Past Master of the Perkins Lodge No. 402 of Pennsylvania and was a 32nd Degree member of the Benjamin Franklin Consistory. He also held the rank of Captain of the Old Guard of the City of Philadelphia and was member of the Forty Plus Eight Voiture 1 of Philadelphia. We celebrate his life.
